### Guide to Getting Around Munich

#### **From the airport into the city**

From Munich airport you can take the S-Bahn or the non-stop Lufthansa Airport Bus to the Hauptbahnhof (main train station) in the heart of the city.

#### *S-Bahn*

The best bet is probably the S-Bahn, which takes 45–50 minutes and leaves the airport every ten minutes or so. There are two lines (S1 and S8) and both head into town, travelling through all the central stations (including the main train station – Hauptbahnhof).

There are ticket machines in the airport terminal (T1) before you descend to the S-Bahn platform, as well as on the platform itself. In Terminal 1 by the escalators going down to the S-Bahn there is also an information and sales desk for tickets. This is the recommended option since dealing with the ticket machines can be trying, at the best of times!

#### *Tickets*

Coming from the Airport, you'll need a ticket that covers all zones (Gesamt Netz) – a day card (Tageskarte) for all zones costs €10.80 for one person, or €19.60 for groups of up to 5 people (Partner Karte).

Another nice option is to buy a 3-day (3 Tage) card (€13.30 for one person, €22.80 for up to 5 people). These however are only available for the inner zone – quite enough for your Munich ramblings, but you'll also need a day card for the outer zone to get you from the airport into the city centre (€5.40 for one person, €9.80 up to 5 people).

All day cards are valid for all buses, U- and S-Bahn and trams in the city, up to 6am the following morning!

**Don't forget to push your ticket into one of the blue validation boxes at the entry to the S-Bahn or on the platform.**

### *Lufthansa Airport Bus*

The Lufthansa Airport Bus service leaves the airport from several locations (see signage when you come through Arrivals) every 20 minutes and costs €17 for a return ticket. You can get off in north Munich (Schwabing) or at the main train station.

### **Within Munich**

For days when you're not heading to or from the airport, a day card for the Inner Zone is enough – €5.40 for one person, €9.80 for the Partner Card ...up to five people travelling together.

Alternatively you can buy a stripe-card (Streifen Karte) which costs €12.00 for 10 stripes. You need to remember to stamp the stripes before each journey in the blue box by the entrance to all platforms. You need to use two stripes for most journeys, just one stripe if you're just going one or two stations further.
